Division Director 2 Aviation (Security Operations) – This position performs complex airport security management duties including the direct supervision of a security force; direct supervision for the airport access control system and all components of the airport identification and preparation and distribution process as required by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA); coordinates and directs departmental security training programs, including all training related to security operations; represents the Assistant Aviation Director, Operations on various committees on matters relating to security and law enforcement; evaluates budget forecasts and monitors expenditures for the Security Operations Division; develops policies and procedures affecting the security operations and related administration areas; formulates strategic planning initiatives related to security; provides specific information on relevant security matters to the Airport Security Coordinator for procuring funding from federal, state and local agencies for development and implementation of departmental security program.

Minimum qualifications: Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, Law Enforcement, Police Science or related field. A minimum of four to eight years of progressively responsible experience in administering security programs to include two years of supervisory experience in an airport security or operations setting is required.

Salary: \$82,903 - \$130,336 annually
