Overview:

Situated along the Gulf of Mexico, Okaloosa County is comprised of a little more than 600,000 acres with the Eglin Air Force Base Reservation covering 240,000 of those acres. Okaloosa County's population is over 192,000 and around 60,000 of those are directly affiliated with the armed forces.

Job Description:

Provides leadership, management, supervision and administration of the Airport Police Division. Responsible for all aviation security and law enforcement in support of the Airport Security Programs and public safety at the three county airports.

Minimum Requirements:

Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business or closely related field; supplemented by a minimum of four (4) years of progressively responsible experience in law enforcement work, two (2) years of which shall be in a supervisory/management capacity; or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience. Supervisory experience in airport security activities including responsibility for the development/enforcement of security programs at a commercial service airport subject to 49 CFR Part 1542 is preferred. Must be a Florida Certified Law Enforcement Officer. Must meet statutory requirements as outlined

in sections 943.13 F.S. (Officers' minimum qualifications for employment or appointment) and 943.135 F.S. (Requirements for continued employment). Requires a valid driver license.
